

ALL THE STEAK YOU CAN EAT TURNS OUT TO BE HORSE MEAT

**Chicagoans Feel Fine Until
They Learn What They
Had Been Served.**

CHICAGO, July 6 (UP)—Hundreds of Chicago restaurant patrons got all the roasts, cutlets and steaks they could eat at five cafes this week. They felt fine until tonight, when police informed them they had been eating horse meat.

Police said five vendors had been arrested on suspicion of selling horsemeat for consumption by diners who thought they were getting something else.

Police were visiting more than 50 establishments on Chicago's north and west sides to inform proprietors that the "beef" roasts, steaks, cutlets and hamburger they have been dispensing recently may not have been beef.

Ralph Zaccarielli, who had 800 pounds of horse meat in his car, was arrested Friday. He said the meat had come from a dog food concern and was being resold to restaurants and hamburger stands. Other arrests followed. By tonight police had collected 1600 pounds of horse meat.

Police said some of the vendors had paid 15 cents a pound for the meat and sold it at an average of 50 cents a pound. Dealers got up to 75 cents, police said.
